Principal's Message

A common parade message is the link between being responsible for your feelings to your attitudes and actions. A big concept but students who blame others for their feelings and therefore their actions have missed the opportunity to influence the person they have the biggest impact on themselves. There are many examples of students who have been upset at another individual's behaviour when they modified their responses and thinking the problem ceased for them. The other child didn't change one bit but suddenly they were much happier for changing their thinking and the subsequent actions. I use the example of road rage, we may not control whether someone cuts us off in traffic but we can decide whether we are going to let their problem be our problem and impact on our day.

It has been gratifying to hear new and prospective families identifying they have heard good things about the school. New families and visitors to our school can draw comparisons to what we have known for a long time now. I am most pleased for the staff involved in the hard work over the years who have transformed the opportunities and outcomes for our students. I hope students, staff and parents can proudly say they work, learn and are a part in this school.

Year 6 Leadership 2022

Students interested in a leadership position for 2022 are undertaking a nomination and selection process. The best indicator of how a student will go in these future roles is to look at how they have acted in the past. Boyne Island has various leadership activities that students can do leading up to the more formal leadership positions. Students will complete a 1 day program involving the Environmental Centre. The older students within the school play a very important role in setting a culture within the school. The younger students look up to and follow the examples set by the older students.

Student Booklist

The bulk purchase of student materials (book packs) is now done for families through a private supplier (Kookaburra) who will supply the bulk materials at reasonable costs. To allow for the delivery schedule, orders need to be received by the due date (Sun 31/10) for collection at the school. Families using this private supplier ensure students have access to the equipment that is required and don't have to source items individually themselves.

There will be no home delivery of packs this year and only limited supplies for **new** families in 2022 carried by the school. Families facing financial difficulties, unable to pay by the Kookaburra deadline, please contact the school who will arrange for an order to be placed, with payment to the school later.

Families who would like to take up the opportunity need to order online by Sunday 31st October. Information has been sent home by email.

Morning drop-off

Students are encouraged or expected to arrive before 8:30am with the first bell at 8:50am. With Covid-19, students arriving at 8:15am were directed to their year level covered areas. We are going back to the routine that students arriving before 8:30am are seated at the Year 2 eating area.

Principal Matters

World Teachers Day- Friday 29th October

Teachers are continually renewing their knowledge and skills to ensure their profession remains vital and effective. World Teachers Day celebrates the role teachers' play in a constantly changing world. It is great to acknowledge the valuable contribution of teachers to our communities.

Student Resource Scheme

The school operates a Student Resource Scheme where texts and other equipment are provided on hire to the students. To simplify and make the scheme as cheap as possible some of the equipment that can be used from year to year will be left to families to supply ie; coloured pencils, crayons etc. The school will take responsibility for managing the supply of some of the critical consumable items like pencils for the entire year, so families will not need to resupply for these items. Information will be sent out early November with the Agreement form to indicate participation for each child, for families not yet in the scheme. Invoicing will be sent at the start of 2022 with the ability to spread payments over the first 3 terms if required, for all families in the scheme.

I appreciate families supporting uniform this year. For winter, families not desiring the official jacket, jumpers were black or red. Please keep that in mind for next year when making purchases. For students in Year 1 to 6 when circumstances mean uniform is not available a "Uniform Slip' is issued at the office

It has been pleasing not having to remind students about uniform aside from small indiscretions regarding bracelets and nail polish.

Year 5 Leadership Program

In preparation for their roles as school leaders in 2022, the Year 5 students are invited to attend a leadership program in conjunction with the Boyne Island Environmental Education Centre. The students will be involved in activities designed to encourage team work, build self-confidence and inspire trust between peers.

Thursday 4th November – BIEEC (8:30am to 3:00pm - variety of leadership activities including problem solving, high & low ropes, canoeing, etc.)

Students have been advised that their behaviour at school would play a big part in whether they would be <u>extended an invitation</u> to attend the program. For students, to be invited, they must demonstrate that they have made a commitment to their learning and that they will follow all instructions given by teachers at all times. Invitations to attend will be monitored leading up to the event and changed as required.

There are *three categories of invitation*:

Open invitation to participate in the day as no behaviour issue is anticipated.

Open Invitation- Monitoring Past behaviours indicate that behaviour should be monitored during Term 4 to ensure that the invitation to attend is still appropriate.

No invitation is extended at this time

Traffic Safety

Pittsbay Crescent - We don't start releasing Prep students (solos without siblings) until 2:50pm.

Parents waiting in the actual pick up area should be in their vehicles as it is a two minute loading zone at that time. (We have asked parents needing to get out to load students to either use the carpark or ensure they are in the front half of the pick up zone when loading.

If cars arrive before 2:50pm, prior to students departing, then waiting on the Pittsbay Crescent roadway is actually a traffic offence because it is blocking through traffic. Prior to 2:50pm if you are on the road you are blocking through access, particularly to the car park entry. hen options are to park in the carpark and exit at an appropriate time or circulate the block.

Being accurate in arrival times helps to avoid congestion although patience and respect needs to be in supply because at peak times congestion is likely around a school with 420 students departing.
