

Principal Matters

Grandparents' day has become my favourite day. We receive good feedback on both the day and how they perceive the school providing opportunities. It may not be a random poll because by attendance they are indicating some support but I choose to trust their wisdom.



<u>Classroom opening time - 8:50am, Term 2 What have we learnt thus far.</u>

The older students are talking more and not as heightened entering to start the day. It was a sensory overloaded environment at the covered area.

Families looking to drop off early to get to work, have still been able to do that with limited supervision. Schools are known to operate 9-3 so until that structure changes balancing work and child care is always going to be a struggle for families. Some families are thankful for access to Outside Hours School Care

Families who think their child needs movement to start the day have kept students at home longer to do so.

- Students arriving from 8:30 to 8:50am will sit at their year level eating areas.
- No teachers will be on duty before school.
- The oval and playgrounds remain closed. Handball is not provided for.
- Students will be encouraged to time their arrival and if arriving early will be encouraged to sit and read or talk quietly.
- At 8:50am when bell goes, students can line up for collection by class teacher. Some staff may open rooms slightly earlier so students can move directly to the room rather than line up.

School Dress Code

Sports shirts are no longer available and 2024 the last year of their phasing out. le Can still be worn on PE days. The 2 sports carnivals will be FREE dress for the wearing of House shirt colours. (ie. Obtain a cheap polo in House Colour for the 2 sports carnivals if desired). Day to day we will all be looking consistent as part of the one Boyne Island State School team in red shirts.

All Prep to Year 3 students run.

Girls will run first in each age group with the boys starting approximately 3 minutes after the girls. Except for the 12 years and 6 years age groups, boys and girls will all start at the same time due to lower numbers.

5K Class News

Life in 5K, Term 1 by Mia and Abby

During HASS we have been learning about natural disasters such as fires, cyclones, droughts and floods. We are also learning about how to prepare for a natural disaster and how to plan a town and where things should be located.

In Maths we are learning about long division, short division and multiplication. Bookwork is very important and the way we set out our equations helps us with our accuracy i.e., the traditional way of long division which is done in columns. We've also had a look at data collection, graphing and fractions

During English we have been reading our amazing novel, Deltora Quest written by Emily Rodda. The whole class has been captivated by the book and we can't wait to see what's going to happen in the next chapter. In our assessment we have been analysing the characters Emily Rodda has created in the story. Deltora Quest is the first novel in a series of 7 and lots of us can't wait to get onto the next book to see where the quest continues on from book 1.

Some of 5k's writing goals are – start with a topic sentence and elaborate and use complex sentences in our writing.

Our reading goals include making a mental picture in our head (Emily Rodda does a fantastic job of this) and re-read the text to make see if it makes sense.

Maths - In 5K we have been learning about multiples, fractions and division.

In English we have been learning about writing paragraphs using the Peel and Teel Method, which is Topic, Point of view, evidence, examples and links. We have been reading the fiction book called "Deltora's Quest – The Forest of Silence".

This term in HASS we've learnt about Natural disasters and impacts on the environment and mapping.

Mr Zammit has been teaching us about solids, liquids and gases, chemical reactions and how to make jelly in science.
